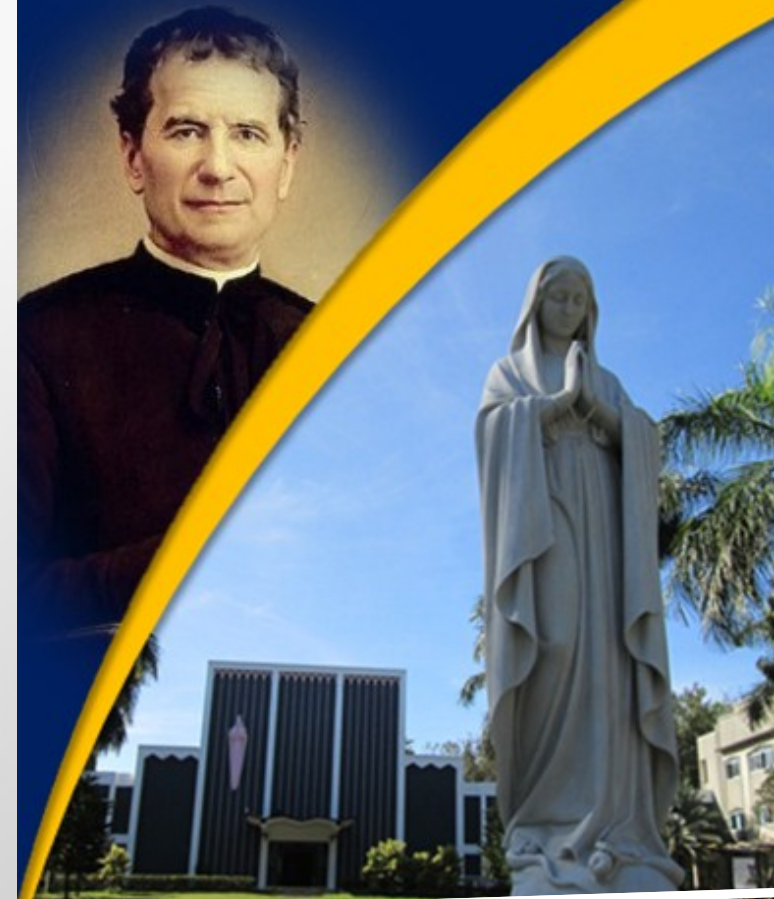

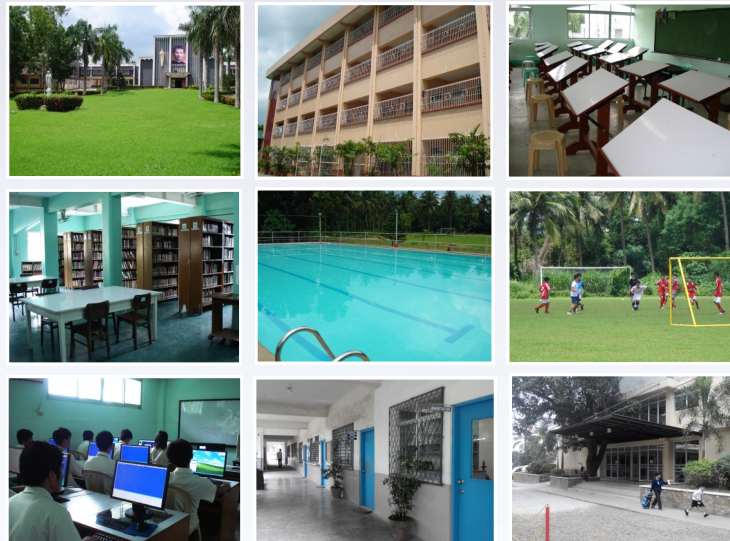
## Welcome to **DON BOSCO COLLEGE**

Don Bosco College, Canlubang is a private Catholic educational institution owned and operated by the Salesians of Don Bosco. Established in 1963, primarily as a seminary for Salesian vocation. It is located at Canlubang, Calamba City, Laguna, Philippines.

In 1967, the Philippine government recognized its Bachelor of Science in Education (BSE) course. Two years later, the school's curriculum for the course in Bachelor of Science in Industrial Education (BSIEd) was also approved. In 1972, the institution started an outreach program called the Manpower Training Department (MTD) for low-income students which is today the Technical—Vocational Education & Training (TVET) Department. In 1995, DBC opened the college to extern (non seminarian) students. A year after, the population of extern students increased as the Bachelor of Science in Technical Education course was recognized by the Commission on Higher Education (CHED).

In 1996 two communities in Canlubang were formed due to restructuring: the Post Novitiate Community and Don Bosco College – the former focusing on the formation of young Salesians and the latter on education and on formation of young aspirants to religious life.

Don Bosco accepted its first batch of high school students in 1998, composed of 47 young men who graduated in 2002. It was also in 2002 that the college department began accepting female students.
